4. "Learning outcomes" and specific skills acquired

Essential objectives of the discipline were: 1) Knowledge of archaeological remains and written sources related to the period and space mentioned and 2) Understanding the historical evolution and ethno-cultural processes in the extra-Carpathian Space in the First Millennium AD.

The main topics addressed were: 1. The Danube Plain in the sec. I p. Chr.: written sources and archeological vestiges; 2.Davae them from Siret and their role until the Roman conquest; 3. Dacians, Sarmatians and Romans in the sec. II-III AD in the area between the Carpathians and the Danube; 4. Dacians, Sarmatians and Romans in the sec. II-III AD in the area between the Carpathians and the Prut; 5. Dobrodja in sec. I-VI pp. Chr.; 6. Locals and foreigners in the sec. IV-VI AD in the extra-Carpathian space; 7. Romanesque and allogeneic in the sec. VII-X pp. Chr.; 7. The essential coordinates of the Romanization process in the extra-Carpathian area.

Both the written sources and the archeological discoveries were taken into account, highlighting the existing limits in the analysis of the information about the historical past, of their causes. A number of alternative hypotheses for interpreting historical facts have been proposed, based on available information.
